

THE UNIVERSITY OF CALGARY SEEKS MEDICAL GRADUATES FOR RESEARCH STUDY

The Medical Communication Assessment Project (MCAP) is conducting a three year comprehensive study that examines the successes and challenges faced by International Medical Graduates (IMGs) as they pursue their goal to become licensed in Alberta. The purpose of the study is to provide decision makers, medical educators, and medical associations with the evidence they need to direct policy advances provincially and nationally. The study will compare the experiences and outcomes of IMGs with both Canadian Medical Graduates and Canadians who have done their medical training overseas. The study is interested in interviewing IMGs from the point of application to licensure (i.e. from the initial examination stage, into residence, to full licensure, and into practice).

We are currently seeking the following participants:

- 1. Canadian IMGs** who have done their medical training overseas and are seeking residency positions in Canada
- 2. International Medical Graduates** who are currently seeking licensure or have previously sought licensure and have discontinued for whatever reason
- 3. Canadian Medical Graduates** who are currently in residence (those in their final year of Family Medicine are preferred)

Involvement in the study consists of participation in one or more interviews. Stipends will be paid for each interview.
